

Educational Scholarship 2024

1. Scholarship Program

The AHEPA Chapter 131 Educational Scholarship Program has scholarships, which were established to promote, encourage, induce, and advance education at the college, university, and graduate school level. Scholarship awards will be \$500.00 each, not to exceed \$2,000 per year.

2. Eligibility

In order to apply and be eligible for a scholarship, the applicant must be able to certify that one of the following requirements are satisfied:

- a. A high school graduate or a high school senior planning to attend, full time, an accredited college or university during the school calendar with a minimum of a 3.0 cumulative GPA.
- b. A college student currently attending an accredited college or university and will continue to attend, full time, during the current calendar year. You must also have a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA.
- c. A college or university graduate planning to attend, full time, a graduate or professional degree program during the calendar year. You must also have a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA.
- d. A college or university graduate working full time and taking at least 6 credit hours per semester. You must in the prior semester have a 3.0 GPA, or a cumulative 3.0 GPA.

<u>IMPORTANT:</u> Please note that along with satisfying one of the above requirements, the applicant must also be an AHEPA Chapter 131 Member, or Son or Daughter of said Member in Good Standing of the AHEPA Chapter 131. Applicants with Deceased or Divorced Parents will be given consideration to the above, as long as they are a Descendent of a Current Member.

3. Filing

This scholarship is applicable for 2024 only.

Application requirements and checklist:

- b. Academic Transcript
- c. Essay
- d. Two Letters of Recommendation for current High School Students see Section 12

The Applicant is responsible for the submission of all documents and completion of all sections of this application and mailing the application package by any delivery service that can ascertain proof of delivery certified mail/ return receipt requested or FedEx postmarked not later than

April 15, 2024 to the following address:

All information will be kept confidential and no items will be returned. Applications postmarked after April 15, 2024 will not be considered.

4. Application Requirements

Academic Transcript

- a) High School seniors and college freshman must submit official high school transcript including S.A.T. and / or A.C.T. scores.
- b) College undergraduates (sophomores or juniors) must submit official current college transcript.
- c) College seniors and graduate students must submit both official undergraduate college and graduate school transcripts. Graduate students should submit GRE or MCAT scores if applicable.

NOTE: All transcripts must be received from the school directly to the AHEPA Chapter 131 accompanying the application in a separate sealed envelope.

Essay

5. Personal data

Applicants must submit an essay, typewritten and at least 300 words, but not to exceed 500 words. The topic of the essay must address The AHEPA Organizations Ideals and how it applies to you Now, <u>OR</u> in the Future. The essay should highlight the applicant's ability to organize and communicate ideas and demonstrate composition and overall writing skills.

Letters of Recommendation

Applicants must include two letters of recommendation from a person such as a teacher, counselor, pastor, etc.. These letters should not come from a relative of the applicant.
